"Homecoming Parade" (Genesis 33:1-17) The Book of Genesis, part 36 Sunday, April 21st, 2024

Sermon Summary

- When Jacob and his older brother finally became reunited, Esau ran to meet Jacob and embrace him (Gen. 33:1-4).
- The Jacob that came home after 30+ years away, arguably returned, mentally, spiritually, and physically broken.
- Esau questioned why his brother presented him with gifts, and Jacob replied that he did so to gain his brother's favour (v. 8).
- Jacob accepted that all that he had personally gained was not due to his own hard work or action, but given him by the very grace and power of God alone (v. 11).
- Esau invites his brother to follow him home to the area of Seir, but Jacob chose to go elsewhere (v. 12-17); perhaps still not trusting in his brother's mercy; but more importantly, because Seir was not located in the Land of Canaan, the land of God's promise, where the Lord was calling him home to.
- Our own forgiveness of another, isn't dependent upon the other person's acceptance of forgiveness; but is reliant instead, upon our own willingness to forgive.
- The manner in which we are called to forgive others, is not the same manner in which God forgives us; for God cannot forgive us of our sin, if we don't ever acknowledge that we have sinned in the first place, and take ownership of our sin.
- Scriptures are clear, that our sins against God (and others), demand consequences. The inevitable cost of sin is death, and involves an eternal separation from God, forever.
- God's forgiveness possesses the extraordinary power to absolve a person of their guilt of sin.

When we recognize the sin present in our lives, and with a contrite heart, approach the Lord, asking for His forgiveness; He can, not only forgive those sins, but remove these sins from our hearts, once and for all time
