"For Forgiveness" (Luke 23:32-49) Epic Easter, pt. 2: The Crucifixion Sunday, April 13th, 2025

Sermon Summary

- Following the Passover meal, Jesus set out to pray in a garden near to the Mount of Olives, where late in the evening, Judas led an armed group to ambush and seize Him (Luke 22:39-53).
- After appearing before a Jewish council, Jesus was led before both Pilate (the province's Roman governor) and Herod (the local ruler); with neither leader finding Jesus guilty of anything.
- Practicing an annual Passover tradition, whereby a criminal would be offered amnesty, Pilate presented to the growing crowd, both Jesus, and a murderer named Barabbas; but the crowd chose to spare Barabbas' life, forcing Pilate to sentence Jesus to death (Luke 23:18-25).
- We shouldn't focus our attention so much upon the HOW
 Jesus was hung; but rather, the WHY - along with WHAT
 happened as He hung on the cross, prior to physically dying.
- Was it on account of his belief, his personal acceptance that Jesus was the Christ... the Promised Messiah... that the thief could be rescued from eternal death (Luke 23:39-43)?
- The torn curtain at the time of Christ's death (Matt. 27:51), should be viewed as a symbolic representation that access to God was no longer restricted; but rather, due to Christ's sacrifice, all those who believe, can have their sins forgiven.
- The crowd that had gathered to watch Christ's execution couldn't possibly walk away that day, without having what they just witnessed affect change in their minds, or in their hearts.
- And Peter said to them, "Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." – Acts 2:38

Christ didn't just stress that we ask for forgiveness when we've wronged others; but by His own example, Jesus modeled for us how we should openly offer forgiveness even to those who have wronged us as well.
