Sermon Summary

- When Jethro witnessed Moses working to resolve all of Israel's disputes on his own; Moses' father-in-law urged him to seek the assistance of others, else he and the people would eventually wear themselves out (v. 13-23).
- When people work together with a shared purpose, the load becomes lighter, and the burdens less burdensome.
- Listening to the world's lies could cause us to become more independent, and less likely to accept others' help.
- It's not just grueling work hearing about people's grudges; it's also hard and belabouring work to hold grudges too!
- The care of the church should never be placed upon the shoulders of one person alone; but rather, its care should fall upon the entirety of the whole church family.
- There is no greater area in our life where we need to humble ourselves and ask for help, as there is, when it comes to our own sinful condition.
- When we work alone, we might think that we are acting selflessly; but by doing so, we selfishly deprive others of the opportunity to themselves serve as well.
- When it comes to our own church family, we're not just serving others; but we are ultimately serving God.
- God doesn't need our help, but it pleases Him whenever we serve Him, our serving Him another form of worship.
- Do you think God is more pleased when 10 people do the work of 100, or when 100 people do the work of 100?
- When we join together arm and arm in life and ministry, the JOY we experience can be gloriously shared & multiplied.

Attempting to face difficulties alone; only makes our challenges even more challenging.
