Sermon Summary

- God didn't act to release Israel from slavery in Egypt simply to grant to them personal freedom; but to permit His people the freedom to openly worship and serve Him.
- Prior to God settling upon Mount Sinai in the midst of the people of Israel, the Lord demanded that the Israelites consecrate themselves (Ex. 19:9-15).
- The consecration of an individual demanded that a person remove or separate themselves from things that were deemed 'unclean;' intentionally detaching themselves from that which was unfit to be near to God's holy presence.
- Due to the physical presence of God's perfect holiness, the mountain itself, God's dwelling place would become holy; and anything else's presence would only act to violate this sacred place in desecration.
- Moses' ability to climb up the mountain to become nearer to God was entirely due to God's grace, Moses obediently responding to the Lord's own personal invitation.
- What God is more concerned with, is an individual's heart, not their outward actions. What concerns God, is that we faithfully follow Him in obedience, in all areas of our lives!
- It wasn't the Israelites' bodies that were becoming purified, but their own individual hearts; as God's people collectively sought to follow the Lord in obedience.
- Our hearts will ever remain stained with sin; sin that prevents us from ever drawing near to God's presence, unless we are permitted to do so, by His grace!
- So long as we live upon this sinful, fallen earth, we will ever remain in conflict with sin; all the days of our lives faced with temptations that we can only resist in God's power.
