The Book of Exodus, pt. 10

Sermon Summary

- Prior to leaving Egypt, Moses collected the bones of his ancestor Joseph (Ex. 13:19); who generations earlier, had insisted on his death bed that he be buried in the land God promised to His people Israel (Gen. 50:24-25).
- As they left Egypt, God led the Israelites towards the Promised Land, appearing as an impressive pillar of cloud by day, and a pillar of fire at night (13:22-22).
- After centuries of oppression in Egypt:
 1. The Israelites had been granted their freedom;
 2. They had been fortuitously sent packing with all of Egypt's treasures;
 3. And God led from the front, steering them clear of opposition, and guarding them from harm.
- God notified Moses that He would act to harden Pharaoh's heart, leading the Egyptian king to pursue the Israelites in an attempt to recapture them. God's plan was not to endanger the Israelites, but that He would be glorified, and the Egyptians recognize that He is the LORD (Ex. 14:4).
- When the Israelites saw hundreds of Egyptian chariots approaching them, they lamented ever leaving Egypt; concluding it would have been better to live as slaves in Egypt than to die free men and women in the wilderness. However, Moses reassured Israel that the Lord would fight for them, to gain for them salvation (v. 11-14).
- When God fights on our behalf, it doesn't always involve physical force, nor even the defeat of human enemies.
- There is nothing that we can humanly do, to possibly rid ourselves of the sin that stains our hearts.
- The people of Israel were saved entirely because of God's mercy and the Lord's willingness to fight for them; God faithfully fulfilling His promise to advocate for His people.

All those who believe, can be confidently assured that God still faithfully fights on behalf of His people.
