"Don't Be A Burden" (2nd Thess. 3:6-12) The Letter of 2nd Thessalonians, pt. 6 Sunday, March 9th, 2025

Sermon Summary

- As he continues to close his second letter to the church in Thessalonica, Paul urges the community to keep away from those amongst them who are walking in idleness (3:6).
- By his own example, Paul himself laboured to provide for himself when in Thessalonica, so as not to be a burden (3;7-8).
- Work was a part of God's design for creation right from the very beginning, prior even to sin's arrival (Gen. 3:17-19).
- This group of Thessalonian believers was presumably idle, not because they were physically unable to work; but they were not willing to work, because their needs were being met due to the kind generousity of others in the church.
- The most likely cause of the idlers' refusal to work was because they believed that Christ's return was imminent.
- Paul accepted the charity of others; a) when it didn't interfere
 with his sharing of the gospel; and b) when his reliance upon
 others wouldn't negatively affect his or the gospel's credibility.
- Paul reasoned that his delivery of the message was more important than any financial compensation for doing so.
- Paul's mission was to share of the good news of Jesus Christ;
 and he viewed it as his calling, not his occupation.
- Our kind support of another believer might not just be a helping hand, but involve loving, sensitive correction as well.
- The idle Thessalonians weren't acting in ignorance, but in selfish disobedience to the earlier presented tradition (v. 6).
- The church's collective care for the idle can actually act to take away our attention and care from others who may be in real desperate need.
- If we don't stop blindly helping the idle, will there ever arise a real need for those we're supporting, to stand on their own?

We labour not just to provide for ourselves, but to relieve others from the burden of supporting us.
