"What is Baptism?" (Matthew 3:11-17) Baptism Sunday

Sermon Summary

- The Greek term 'baptidzo' literally means 'to dip, immerse, or plunge,' and can be understood as not just a description, but direction as to how a baptism should be performed in order to symbolically represent death, burial, and resurrection (Romans 6:4-11).
- John's baptism was arguably not done to prepare people to approach God, but to prepare them for God's own approach, in the person of Jesus Christ (Matt. 3:11).
- Baptism should be viewed as an individual's public declaration of their choice to personally pursue a life of righteousness.
- The bible speaks of two separate baptisms: the Baptism of the Spirit (which occurs upon conversion); and Believer's Baptism (an individual choosing to becoming physically baptized).
- To become more like Christ, we need constant help, guidance and equipping from God, given us by the work of the Spirit.
- Baptism is an act of repentance, an individual not so much doing so to right a wrong, but recognize their many wrongs.
- We ought to ever avoid mistakenly thinking that baptism grants to us salvation, and not see our salvation as the free gift of grace that it is.
- Baptism involves an open invitation for our fellow believers to support, guide, direct, and even correct their brother in Christ.
- When we dedicate not just a child, but a whole family unto the Lord, parents extend an invitation for the church community to help and support them, much like one does when baptized.

Questions to ask of yourself, if considering baptism...

- 1. Have you heard the good news of the gospel?
- 2. Do you believe this good news to be true?
- 3. Have you then committed your life to Christ, desiring to follow His commands and turn away from a life of sin?
