"The Settling of Israel" (Genesis 35:1-15) The Book of Genesis, part 38 Sunday, May 12th, 2024

Sermon Summary

- Though Jacob and his family had returned to Canaan, the Land of Promise, God directly instructed Jacob to return to and live in Bethel (Gen. 35:1).
- Prior to returning to Bethel, Jacob ordered his family to:
 - Get rid of their idols.
 - 2. Purify themselves.
 - 3. Change their garments (v. 2).
- Contrary to Jacob's earlier fears (Gen. 34:30), none of the people of the land interfered with his clan's journey, so terrified were they of the Lord's power (Gen. 35:5).
- Even in those instances when Jacob strayed, God provided him with opportunities to learn and grow from his mistakes.
- Jacob was effectively preparing his family to rededicate themselves to the Lord; as he wasn't calling upon his family to just change appearance, he was calling upon them to change their hearts.
- Following Jacob's arrival in Bethel, he recalled two earlier interactions with the Lord: 1) when he first fled from his brother, stopping in Bethel (Gen. 28); and 2) when after Jacob returned to Canaan, he wrestled with God all night (Gen. 32).
- God now gave to Jacob a 'renewed' blessing, further establishing how, by following the Lord in obedience and returning home, Jacob's family would begin a legacy of greatness (Gen. 35:11).
- In spite of all his flawed efforts and foolish decisions, God still
 chose to bless Jacob, and allow him to be the foundation of
 God's special people, the entire nation of Israel.

Perhaps the most remarkable thing about the story of Jacob, is not Jacob's own actions; but rather God's patience, grace, and mercy with this flawed individual.
