"The Sacrificial Lamb" (Ex. 11:1-12:28) The Book of Exodus, pt. 8 Sunday, Nov. 16th, 2025

Sermon Summary

- An angry Pharaoh ordered Moses to leave from his sight following the outcome of a ninth plague; but prior to his departure, Moses warned the Egyptian king of a tenth and final plague, that would result in Israel's release (Ex. 11:1-10).
- To become spared from a plague involving the death of every firstborn in Egypt, each Israelite household would be required to sacrifice a spotless lamb, its blood placed upon the home's doorframe, and its flesh eaten at a meal (Ex. 12:1-28).
- 'Girding one's loins' or 'tucking one's cloak into their belt,'
 identified a preparedness to run unhindered; and preparing
 bread without yeast additionally eliminated the need for the
 family to wait for the dough to rise; which would permit the
 Israelites to leave Egypt without delay, once the LORD called.
- On the eve of the Passover, the LORD would 'pass over' an entire nation; enacting His judgment upon those who refused to accept Him as their God.
- Everything had unfolded as per God's sovereign plan, the LORD's incomparable power and authority openly displayed before the nation of Egypt.
- Sin held a firm, inescapable grip upon our lives until God remembered His covenant, and intervened.
- Jesus Christ, the Son of God's own blood would be poured out
 not upon a doorframe, but to stain a wooden cross.
- All those who believe, and place their trust in the saving work of Jesus Christ, can accept and receive the great and abundant mercy of God's grace.

In ancient Egypt, several lambs were slain, and their blood poured out, so that each Israelite household might escape God's wrath.

Generations later, another sacrificial Lamb would become slain, its blood poured out so that the entire human race might escape God's wrath.
