Sermon Summary

- After God spoke to Moses through a burning bush (Ex. 3:1-4:17)
 he approached his father-in-law Jethro to become freed from
 his shepherding responsibilities, so that he could return to
 Egypt and check on his fellow Israelites' well-being (Ex. 4:18).
- That Moses didn't share with Jethro the true purpose behind his return to Egypt might indicate that he still had doubts, or maybe feared that Jethro would have doubted his abilities too.
- Prior to Moses' arrival in Egypt, God shared with him that He would harden Pharoah's heart, so that the Egyptian king would not release Israel. God not only knew that Pharaoh would refuse to let His people go, but He actually ordained it.
- Everything that surrounds Pharaoh, the instances and experiences that acted to shape his life and influence his decisions, are still a part of God's own creation.
- The Lord ensured that the Pharaoh would act true to his nature, arrogantly refusing to offer empathy to the Israelites and let God's people go.
- Before arriving in Egypt, God considered putting Moses to death because he had not yet circumcised his son (4:24-26).
- Moses' failure to circumcise his son likewise revealed his failure to act like a true member of God's obedient covenant community too.
- Moses' wife Zipporah intervened however, circumcising their son, and placing the bloody remnant at her husband's feet; appeasing God's anger, so that the life of Moses became spared.
- Even though Aaron and Moses may have delivered God's message in Egypt, it would be God's power that would bring Israel out of captivity.

Though the Lord needs not our help; at times, He will use us to accomplish His sovereign will.
